# CALHOUN COUNTY'S BEST CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE CONTEST-2018

## Rules:

1. Make your best chocolate chip cookie! Anything goes, as long as chocolate chips are a standout ingredient!
2. Each recipe must be homemade (no mixes or store bought cookies). You must write your recipe down and bring it with your cookies.
3. Display 12 cookies on a plate wrapped in plastic wrap.
4. There is no age requirement. This means children and adults will be judged together.
5. Judging is based on Taste (50%), Appearance (25%), and Texture (25%).
6. First place receives \$30 in cash. Prizes will be mailed after the fair.

## Special Notes:

1. If the cookie contains nuts or other allergens, please note very clearly on recipe label.
2. This contest is open to Calhoun County residents only.
3. There is no charge or preregistration to enter this contest.

4. Please bring entries to the Expo Center Friday June 13 between 5:30-7:00pm. (This is the same entry time as all open class). Judging will begin at 7:00pm.
5. All exhibits are released at 4:00pm Sunday July 15.
6. Please note, not all contestants will receive a ribbon.
7. The public is allowed to view judging.

# Open Class Division

## General Rules

These rules apply to every class; however each class may also have other requirements. These are listed separately under each division.

1. Entries will be taken in the Calhoun County Expo Center Friday, July 13 between 5:30-7:00 p.m.
2. Entry fees will be charged and ribbons and premiums will be awarded. Entry fee must be paid when you enter to exhibit.
3. Entry Fee; Adults \$.25 per entry Children- FREE
4. Exhibitors may be from Calhoun County or adjacent counties.  
Adult Division- 18 and older Children's Division- Ages 4-17
5. Exhibitors are allowed up to two entries per category. Articles must be made by the exhibitor.
6. No items accepted that have previously won 1<sup>st</sup> place at the Calhoun County Exposition.
7. Best of show ribbons may be awarded if the judge so warrants.
8. The Fairboard will not be responsible for loss of exhibits.
9. Decision of the judges will be final. Blue ribbon awarded only if entry is qualified for 1<sup>st</sup> place in the opinion of the judge.
10. All exhibits will be released at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 15.
11. Articles released early forfeit premiums.
12. The Fairboard will not be responsible for items left more than one hour after release time.
13. Judging will begin around 7:00 p.m. on Friday July 13 and continue until all division are judged.  
\*\*Please note entries and judging will take place all in one day.

## **DIVISION F-FLOWERS**

All specimens, whether cut or container grown, must have been grown by the exhibitor and named. Container grown plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for not less than 3 months. The exception to that is of multiple planting which must have been grown together for at least 6 weeks. Double potting is permitted.

Specimens must be displayed in clear bottles supplied by the exhibitor. They should have no lettering or decorations and should be in proportion to the size of the specimens. A small piece of wood, Styrofoam, or plastic wrap may be inconspicuously placed in the neck of the bottle to promote the specimen upright.

All entries should be clean and well groomed. Self-foliage should be below water level. No polishing or oiling of foliage is permitted. Decision of the judge is final. No noxious weeds allowed.

An exhibitor may have more than one entry in horticulture in any class or sub-class; however, each must be a different cultivator, color, or type.

Exhibitors are responsible for knowing in which class their specimens are to be entered and name the variety. Incorrectly entries entered will not be judged. When entering, put name of flower on back of entry tags.
